Maney has provided support for many nonprofit groups in our area. He has helped the Northeast Georgia Health System, the Medical Center Foundation, Junior Achievement, the Rotary Club of Braselton, Eagle Ranch, the Jackson County Humane Society, Challenged Child & Friends and many others.
